Message from the Clerk of Course

Welcome and thank-you for your interest in East Gippsland Stages 2010.

This Event is Round 1 of the 2010 Victorian Rally Championship and will be held on Saturday 15 May 2010. Based at Lindenow in East Gippsland, Victoria, it will be a State Championship special stage event with all the thrills and spills that these events are famous for.

The roads of East Gippsland are generally easy on the car varying from smooth sandy tracks to well constructed forest logging roads. You will enjoy a wide variety of driving surfaces and conditions This event will run under the A-to-A timing format which is the standard for modern special section forest rallies. It will be conducted over one division and two heats made up of approximately 120 km of competitive and 120 km of transport sections. There will be one service break at which catering and amenities will be available.

The Event (and Heat 1) will commence in Lindenow followed by approximately 60 competitive km finishing with a service break in Lindenow. Heat 2 will be approximately 60 competitive km finishing in Lindenow which will also be the finish of the Event

As a State Championship special stage event, crew members will require a Clubman Rally Licence or superior. Vehicles will be required to be fitted with the usual rollover protection and safety features and crews will be required to wear CAMS-approved flame-resistant clothing.

The East Gippsland Stage finishes at Lindenow for the post event social function and a champagne presentation to the provisional winners.

There are a number of accommodation venues within a short distance of the Event start/finish/headquarters providing a range of accommodation styles to suit varying requirements. We recommend contacting these venues via The Lakes & Wilderness Tourist Centre, telephone 1800 637 060.

I would like to acknowledge and thank all the people and organisations that have contributed to making the East Gippsland Stages possible including the East Gippsland Shire Council, Bairnsdale Police, Lindenow South CFA, Bairnsdale SES, Bairnsdale Ambulance, the Department of Sustainability & Environment, and the many volunteers from inside and outside the Melbourne University Car Club Inc who are giving up their time to help us in the forest.

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EAST GIPPSLAND STAGES

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. EVENT FORMAT

- 1.1 The event known as the “**EAST GIPPSLAND STAGES 2010**”, hereafter known as “the Event”, will be run as a State Championship Special Stage Rally.
- 1.2 The Event will be conducted over public and private roads during the hours of daylight and darkness on Saturday 15 May 2010 in the Lindenow area.
- 1.3 The Event will be run as one division totalling approximately 240 km.
- 1.4 The event will be divided into 2 heats with each heat scored separately for Championship points.
- 1.5 Crews will compete over approximately 9 Special Stages with a total competitive distance of approximately 120 km. The liaison distance will be approximately 120 km.
- 1.6 The entire Event will be route charted with intermediate distances and advisory tulip diagrams being supplied for all Special Stages and liaison sections. Advisory arrows may be erected on Special Stages, at the discretion of the organisers.
- 1.7 The Event will commence from Lindnow at approximately 1230 hrs on Saturday 15 May 2010 and the last car should finish in Lindenow by 2300 hrs.
- 1.8 There will be one central servicing location in Lindenow and one optional remote refuel location in each heat.
- 1.9 All vehicles that complete the specified course will be held in a Parc Fermé for approximately ½ hour after the arrival of the final vehicle into the Parc Fermé. Vehicles may be selected for post event scrutiny during this time.
- 1.10 There will be a presentation to the provisional winners at the end of the Event. This will be held as soon as possible after the arrival of the last car and the conclusion of the final Stewards meeting.

6. ENTRIES

- 6.1 Entries will open and close in accordance with the Event Schedule.
- 6.2 All entries must be on the official Entry Form, complete in every detail and accompanied by the appropriate fee. The official Entry Form is considered to be either the paper document, as found in the 'files' section of <http://www.vicrally.com.au> and submitted to:

- 6.3 The Competitor and crews are reminded of the penalties under the NCR for false statements.
- 6.4 No signatures are required on the Entry Form at the time of submitting the entry, but must be signed at either Official Scrutiny or Event Documentation prior to the commencement of the Event.
- 6.5 For entries submitted electronically with an under 18 co-driver, the parent or guardian of the co-driver must sign the parent/guardian consent form either at Official Scrutiny or Event Documentation.
- 6.6 Entry fees are as set out below.

- 6.7 The entry fee includes the payment of all application fees and levies including trophy fund, publicity fund, road damage fund and CAMS Personal Accident insurance for all listed crew members.
- 6.8 Any cheque or money order should be made payable to '**Melbourne University Car Club Inc.**' Please note cheques may be banked when received. Ensure that there are sufficient funds to cover any cheques submitted. Competitors will be liable to pay any fees incurred by MUCC from their dishonoured cheque/s BEFORE being allowed to start the Event.
- 6.9 Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. If the entry limit of 60 cars is exceeded these subsequent crews will become reserves. Where a number of entries are received on the same day, resulting in the field limit being exceeded, a ballot will be held to determine the starting crews and the order of reserves.
- 6.10 Competitors may change the car or a crew member by notifying the organisers in writing no less than one hour prior to the start of the Event. If such a change is made after the close of entries then the notification is to be accompanied by a payment of \$20.00. If the car is changed after Official Scrutiny the Competitor must arrange scrutiny for the replacement car. If the driver is changed the organisers may re-seed the start number of the crew.

- 6.11 **All correspondence will be sent electronically via email.** No Supplementary Regulations, Further Regulations or Results will be posted in the mail. Please ensure you provide a legible, current and valid email address on your entry form.
- 6.12 Entry fee refunds will be in accordance with the provisions of the VRC Standing Regulations.

7. CREW ELIGIBILITY

- 7.1 The Event will be open to all grades of crew members.
- 7.2 Each crew shall consist of 2 people, one to be nominated as the driver and the other as the co-driver.
- 7.3 Both crew members must be members of a car club affiliated with CAMS and hold a current CAMS Clubman Rally Licence or superior.
- 7.4 The driver and any co-driver intending to drive in the Event must hold a current civil driver's licence valid in Victoria or a permit accompanied by ARCOM's written permission. Co-drivers who do not hold a civil driver's licence must sign a Declaration in accordance with NCR 2.1(iii) and which is attached to these Supplementary Regulations.
- 7.5 Both crew members must have officiated at least one event listed in the Victorian Rally Calendar in the previous year. Crew members new to rallying are exempt from this requirement for their first year of competition. Refer to the Victorian Rally Bulletin for further information.
- 7.6 Both crew members are advised to have a current ambulance insurance valid in Victoria.
- 7.7 To be eligible for awards, crews must display any event promotional material supplied and Championship material as per the VRC Standing Regulations and Bulletins if applicable.
- 7.8 Both crew members will be required to present evidence of their eligibility at Event Documentation (see Article 12).

8. VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY & CLASSES

- 8.1 Competing vehicles must comply with one of the following categories:

Designation	Definition
PRC	Group 3C Production Rally Cars
Group N(Vic)	FIA Group N with the exception that no time limit applies to eligibility
HRC	Historic Rally Cars categories 1, 2 & 3
CRC	Classic Rally Cars and Club Rally Cars

- 8.2 The following classes will apply for the Victorian Rally Championship:

8.2.1 PRC

- 8.3 **Excel Series.** Vehicles must meet the requirements of, and crews must be registered in, the Excel Rally Series Class in order to gain points. See separate Victorian Excel Rally Series Regulations.

9. SCRUTINY

- 9.1 Every competition vehicle must be submitted for examination by a licensed CAMS scrutineer prior to the start of the Event. On being passed by the scrutineer the Competitor must receive a signed scrutiny form stamped with the Scrutineer's official CAMS stamp. The scrutiny form must be presented at Documentation.
- 9.2 Competitors must nominate on the entry form whether they will be attending Official or Regional Scrutiny by ticking the appropriate box. Competitors who reside less than **50** km from the Official Scrutiny location are expected to attend Official Scrutiny.
- 9.3 Official Scrutiny will be held on Wednesday 12 May 2010 at Officer Smith Automotive, 38 Villiers Street, NORTH MELBOURNE (**Melway Map 2A K8**), between the hours of 1800 hrs and 2130 hrs. All crews must have reported to scrutiny by 2100 hrs.
- 9.4 Competitors who decide to change their scrutiny method from Official to Regional or vice-versa **must advise the Entries Secretary** at the latest by 2000 hrs on the day of scrutiny.
- 9.5 Competitors who do not attend Official Scrutiny must arrange their own Regional Scrutiny. Competitors should note that **there will be no provision at the Event for turbo and supercharger sealing**, this will **only** be done at Official scrutineering.
- 9.6 Competitors whose vehicles are Regionally scrutineered may be subject to an inspection by the Chief Scrutineer on the day of the Event.
- 9.7 Competing vehicles must be presented at scrutiny and at the start of the Event in a clean and tidy condition. Any vehicle deemed by the organisers to be dirty or untidy will not be scrutineered nor allowed to start the Event.
- 9.8 Attention will be paid to the noise emissions from the vehicle. Any vehicle exceeding 96 dB(A) when tested in accordance with the procedure specified in the current CAMS Manual may not be allowed to start **or continue** the Event.
- 9.9 Competitors must supply the following compulsory equipment which will be checked at scrutiny:
- Accident Advisory Sign (Red SOS / Green OK)
 - Two safety triangles
 - Helmets and clothing as per CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, Section 6 (General Requirements for Cars & Drivers), Schedule D (Apparel), Table 2.2 (Rally/Road), Gravel/State events.
- 9.10 A white area measuring 500mm wide by 520mm high on each front door must be available to display the vehicle's competition number and any advertising decals which may be provided by the organisers. All competing vehicles will also receive an additional smaller competition number which must be placed on the top left hand side of the windscreen and be clearly visible to officials outside the vehicle.
- 9.11 Competitors with **Historic Rally Cars** must provide documentation to substantiate the vehicle's eligibility for this class (eg Homologation papers). Historic Rally Cars must display their Historic decals (supplied by the Competitor) on the rear side windows.
- 9.12 Competitors with **Classic Rally Cars** must provide documentation to substantiate the vehicle's eligibility for this class (eg Homologation papers). Classic Rally Cars must display the word Classic (supplied by the Competitor) under the number on the side of the vehicle.
- 9.13 The Chief Scrutineer and his assistants are deemed to be judges of fact in all scrutiny matters.

10. OFFICIAL MAPS

- 10.1 Any maps required for the Event will be supplied by the organisers,
- 10.2 Organisers have used Rooftops Bairnsdale – Dargo Adventure Map for event Planning

11. RALLY HEADQUARTERS & OFFICIAL NOTICE BOARD

- 11.1 Rally Headquarters will be located at the Lindenow Sports Oval, Henry Street, Lindenow, and will be open during the times listed in the Event Schedule.
- 11.2 The Official Notice Board will be located at Rally Headquarters while Rally Headquarters is open

12. DOCUMENTATION & BOOK-IN

- 12.1 Documentation verification (checking of licences, etc.) will be held at Official Scrutiny and at Rally Headquarters at the times listed in the Event Schedule. The following items will be checked:
 - a) CAMS Licences of the Competitor, Driver and Co-driver
 - b) Club Membership Cards of the Driver and Co-driver
 - c) Civil Driving Licences of the Driver and Co-driver
 - d) Co-Driver's Declaration (if applicable - see Clause 7.4)
 - e) Proof of officiating fulfilment, Driver and Co-driver (Vic crew members only)
 - f) CAMS Vehicle Log Book
 - g) Vehicle registration papers
 - h) Vehicle scrutiny form
- 12.2 Entry forms that were submitted unsigned must be signed by the Competitor, driver, co-driver and a parent or guardian (for co-drivers under 18) at Documentation verification.
- 12.3 All crews must Book-in prior to the Start between the times listed in the Event Schedule.

- 12.4 Documentation verification and Book-in must be completed before crews are allowed to start the Event.
- 12.5 Additional information regarding Documentation and Book-in may be advised in the Further Regulations/Instructions.

13. STARTING ORDER & CREW BRIEFING

- 13.1 The starting order for the Event will be determined in accordance with the Event Schedule and the VRC Standing Regulations.
- 13.2 Both members of the crew, plus at least one member of their service crew, must attend the Crew Briefing at the time and location listed in the Event Schedule.

14. CONTROLS & TIMING

- 14.1 The Event will use A-A Timing as per NRC 1.33 and include and/or omit rules as per the VRC Standing Regulations. All crews are advised to familiarise themselves with this system of timing prior to the Event.
- 14.2 Electronic beams may be used for timing at the start and finish of competitive sections in place of, or in conjunction with, manual timing by officials. The officials at the Stage Start and Finish locations will be Judges of Fact in regards to information derived from electronic beams.
- 14.3 Crews may book-in early without penalty at specific Time Controls to be advised in the Further Regulations (generally the Event Finish Time Control).
- 14.4 Late running time shall be as per the Victorian Rally Bulletin.

15. REJOINING THE EVENT

- 15.1 Rejoining by crews is permitted in accordance with NRC 6.10 and the VRC Standing Regulations Clause 19 provided:
 - a) They advise the CRO of their intention to rejoin the rally; and
 - b) Their vehicle is inspected by a Scrutineer who subsequently authorises the vehicle to rejoin; and
 - c) They rejoin prior to the passage of the Sweep Car.
- 15.2 Rejoining may also be done at special stage start control(s) as nominated in the Route Instructions and Itinerary.
- 15.3 Rejoining crews will start in a position on the road allocated by the Clerk of Course. This position should be as close as possible to the position on the road held by the crew at the start of the stage that they failed to finish. Crews who do not rejoin at the time required by the position allocated to them will accrue early or late penalties as appropriate.
- 15.4 A rejoining crew will be classified in an Event and relevant Heat results behind any crews who complete the entire Event or Heat as per NRC 6.10.
- 15.5 Missing stages in one Heat will not affect the results of other Heats.
- 15.6 The rejoining crew must consist of the same vehicle, driver and co-driver.

16. CREW CONDUCT

- 16.1 Reconnaissance by crews on the roads in the general area of the Event is forbidden for a period of four weeks prior to the start of the Event.
- 16.2 Any crew found using, or in possession of, pace notes (determined to be such by the absolute discretion of the Clerk of Course in consultation with the Stewards of the event) will be excluded from the event. Spot checks will be carried out during the event.
- 16.3 Liaison sections on this event will be on roads open to the public. Crews must observe all Victorian Traffic Regulations and speed restrictions nominated in the official Route Instructions. In particular

- obey GIVE WAY and STOP signs. Speed may be checked and the relevant penalties will be applied for any infringement. **Crews will be penalised for any infringement of their service crews.**
- 16.4 It is forbidden to leave or throw objects (eg cigarettes, lighted matches) in places that may cause a fire, or to continue competing with a damaged exhaust system (which may also cause a fire). Extreme diligence is required in all matters concerning the risk of fire.
- 16.5 During all Special Stages, crew members are required to wear helmets and clothing as specified in Clause 9.9 of these Supplementary Regulations.
- 16.6 In the event of a car stopping in a special stage a reflective triangle must be displayed in a conspicuous position at least 50m behind the car except where the car does not present a hazard to any following cars and crew or the crew of the stopped car. Following crews sighting the warning triangle must drive with caution and reduce speed until the stopped car has been passed.
- 16.7 Both the warning triangle and the Accident Advisory Sign (red SOS / green OK, as appropriate) and the Car Number Board must be physically shown to the next three vehicles and then must be left on display for the whole length of the period that the car is stopped on the course regardless of whether or not the crew remain with the car.
- 16.8 Failure to display all of these signs may result in disciplinary action being taken.
- 16.9 Crews are required to remove the warning triangle once the stopped car has been moved and no longer presents a hazard or they recommence the competition.
- 16.10 Only the registered crew may travel in the vehicle for the duration of the Event with the exception of cases provided for in the VRC Standing Regulations or in an emergency.
- 16.11 If a member of the crew retires, or if a third person is carried in the vehicle (except where this is to transport an injured person), the vehicle shall be excluded from the Event.
- 16.12 Crews have an obligation to be familiar with the National Competition Rules, the National Rally Code, the Victorian Rally Bulletin and the VRC Standing Regulations. Failure to act in a manner befitting the sport, as deemed by the organisers and/or Stewards of the Event, will result in the crew being charged and penalties issued.
- 16.13 **Alcohol and Drugs.** In accordance with NCR 145A, crews consuming alcohol or competing under the influence of drugs during the Event will be excluded. Crew members may be required to submit to tests to determine the presence or otherwise of prohibited substances. This regulation serves as the required 24-hour notice to Competitors, Crew and Officials.
- 16.14 Any **crew retiring** from the Event **MUST** make contact with Rally Headquarters, either in person or via radio at the next radio point to notify the organisers of their withdrawal. In addition, a Withdrawal Form and an Incident Report (where required) must be either handed to a control official or lodged at Rally Headquarters.
- 16.15 The crew shall be liable for the excess payable on any incident requiring a claim on the CAMS and/or any Public Liability Insurance. Refer to the CAMS website <http://www.cams.com.au> for further information.

17. SERVICING & SERVICE CREWS

- 17.1 The Event will have one service area which will be located at Lindenow Sports Oval. Servicing is prohibited outside this area, .i.e. No intercept servicing is allowed
- There will be an optional remote refuel location in each heat. Only refuelling will be allowed at these locations.
- 17.2 Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the CAMS Manual.
- 17.3 There will not be pump fuel available at the service area. Crews must refuel from their own supplies in the designated refuel areas.
- 17.4 The entry fee includes two service crew nominations. A service crew is deemed to be a vehicle with one or more personnel. Additional service crews may be nominated for a fee of \$15.00 per service crew.
- 17.5 Crews will be issued with a set of Service Crew Instructions for each nominated service crew which will include details of the official service area and supporting maps. Each service crew will also

- receive an identification number which must be placed on the top left hand side of the windscreen of the service vehicle and be clearly visible to officials outside the vehicle.
- 17.6 Service Crew personnel must register and sign-in at Book-in. Only registered service crew personnel will be covered by CAMS Personal Accident Insurance for the Event. The maximum number of service personnel that can be registered per competing vehicle is eight.
- 17.7 Access to service areas may be restricted to registered service crews with the provided signage attached to the vehicle.
- 17.8 It is highly recommended that all service crews supply and have available a working fire extinguisher within the vicinity of their service area.
- 17.9 **Alcohol and Drugs.** Service crew members come under the auspices of the CAMS Anti-doping Policy and may be required to submit to tests to determine the presence or otherwise of prohibited substances. This regulation serves as the required 24-hour notice for such testing.
- 17.10 No waste of any kind is to be left at the service area. Oils, fuels, and other fluids must be drained into appropriate containers for disposal in accordance with EPA regulations.
- 17.11 Any activities that damage the surface of the service area (e.g. spinning of wheels) are forbidden. This is to ensure the availability of the venue for future events.
- 17.12 Crews will be held liable for the actions of their service crews.

18. RESULTS, PENALTIES & PROTESTS

- 18.1 The Clerk of Course reserves the right when compiling results, to take into account any document(s) provided by an official or officials of the Event.
- 18.2 Should a Special Stage be stopped for any reason before the last crew has completed that stage, any crew not completing the stage will be given an allocated time in accordance with the VRC Standing Regulations and the current CAMS Manual subject to Article 18.3.
- 18.3 Only the Stewards of the Event may apply Article 18.2 and only after receiving advice concerning the reason for the stoppage from the Clerk of Course. No crew which is totally or partially responsible for stopping a stage may benefit from this action.
- 18.4 Results will **only** be **sent electronically** and will not be posted in the mail. Please ensure you provide a valid and legible email address on your entry form.
- 18.5 Any protest must be lodged in accordance with NCR Part XII, Protests.

19. EVENT AWARDS

- 19.1 Trophies will be awarded to Drivers and Co-drivers as follows:

- 19.2 Where a crew member qualifies for more than one trophy, the organisers reserve the right to award a single trophy engraved to recognise each achievement.
- 19.3 To be eligible for awards crews must display any event promotional material supplied.
- 19.4 Recipients of trophies, awards or prize money who fail to attend the official presentation and fail to notify the organisers prior to their non-attendance will forfeit their right to their awards and/or prize money.
- 19.5 Details of any further awards and/or prize money will be provided in the Further Regulations.

20. ALTERATION OR ABANDONMENT

- 20.1 The organisers reserve the right to postpone, alter, cancel or abandon the Event in accordance with NCR 59.

21. FURTHER REGULATIONS

- 21.1 Further Regulations will be issued via email after the close of entries and will contain:

- b) Entry List and Crew Details
- c) Availability of Route Instructions
- d) Odometer check
- e) Crew briefing time and location
- f) Start/finish time and location
- g) Service details
- h) Event synopsis (including Heat details)
- i) Additional awards
- j) Additional information or changes deemed necessary by the organisers

APPENDIX 1 - USEFUL INFORMATION

A1.1 SPECTATORS

There will be one spectator point during the daylight stages, to be visited again by crews during the night stages.

A1.2 CATERING
